

Road Rally School and Rally - Feb. 15

The 2020 Cascade road rally season started off with a full house of students eager to learn how to be successful time-speed-distance road ralliers. Sixteen driver-navigator teams endured the crowded two-hour rally school classroom session and immediately set out to run the “practice” final exam road rally.


The rally school swiftly covered essential skills for Cascade TSD road rally: getting ready, knowing the rules, staying on course, avoiding traps, and staying on time. Of course, being on time won't help if you're in the wrong place. Learning how to stay on course is the first priority and you do that by understanding the main road.

In Cascade's TSD road rally world, a main road exists at every intersection. The main road is the rally route you follow if you don't have an executable route instruction for that intersection.

In fact, you can execute a route instruction containing a course directing action only when it takes you off the main road.

Knowing where the main road goes at every intersection and knowing how to follow the route instructions are critical to finishing a road rally. (Make sure they tell you where the finish is before you leave the start. ;-)

The Rally School Rally course started in North Plains, traveled along West Union, Valley Vista, Germantown, Skyline, Jackson Quarry, Helvetia, and points in between, ending at the Helvetia Tavern. The route was about 45 miles long and took a bit over an hour and half to drive - just about half of a Saturday Series rally.



Follow the main road to exit this maze.
White roadway is paved. Grey roadway is gravel.

Many of the road rally concepts presented at rally school were practiced and tested along the way. Four simple rally traps spiced up the event, including Monte's odo trap (take xx minutes to complete the next xx NRIs), a number switch (if Monte puts BENDEMEER in a rally, there's a number switch), and a couple main road traps (L at T. Pause xx. ITIS). They were well protected so even if you do it wrong you end up back on course, with a time penalty.

The GPS app that was used to time and score the rally alerted contestants when they passed a checkpoint. The app displayed their leg time penalty in seconds and noted whether they were early or late and it displayed their cumulative score for the nine timed legs.

Rally school was the first TSD road rally for many of the attendees. Some had attended very few or had only attended rallies hosted by other clubs. It is great to see so many new faces at a Cascade rally event. Some rally veterans (who snuck in) shared their

valuable experience, reinforcing the discussion. The day seemed to strike a positive note and many indicated they plan to come back to run more Cascade rallies this season. Success!

And we're pleased to report that everyone made their way to the finish; and just like veteran ralliers, some found more creative ways to get there. Congratulations to all the Rally School Rally graduates.

What to expect of Saturday Series rallies

The Rally School Rally was created to provide an example of what the Cascade Saturday Series rallies will be like this year in terms of style and format. With GPS timing and scoring, you can expect more legs (more passage controls aka checkpoints).

Overall event length (three to four hours) will remain the same, but legs on average will be shorter.

Passage controls will be noted in the route instructions so you'll know where you need to be on time. You won't know precisely where, but you'll know it's coming up.

Expect fewer traps and simpler traps. As noted, most of the rally school attendees are newcomers to Cascade's rally program. Traps familiar to veteran ralliers (number switch, spelling trap, onto a sign, turn at sideroad, main road traps, etc.) are all new to our new audience.

Official mileage will be provided on more route instructions, as much as possible.

Only paved roads will be used. Gravel will be avoided. Bring out your pretty car.

These rallies will be easier and more fun for the contestants, not to mention much easier to manage from the organizers side. Everybody wins, how about that!

Saturday Road Rally Series - March 21

The Saturday Road Rally Series kicks into gear on March 21. It's a whole new season and even more fun.

The Saturday Road Rally Series offers beginner-friendly time-speed-distance road rallies, lasting from three to four hours, starting and ending in the Portland area.



Entry requires a street-legal vehicle, licensed and insured driver, navigator, and a smart device (e.g., cell phone or tablet) running the Competitor Richta GPS Checkpoints app. The Richta app will be used to time and score the rally.

\$20 per car for CSCC members, \$30 per car for non-members.

Check in opens at 9 am on Saturday, March 21, in the northeast corner of Lowe's parking lot. Review the route instructions and hob nob with rally contestants until the informational meeting at 9:45 am. Listen carefully and ask questions! Then leave the parking lot at 10 am plus

your car number and follow the route instructions to the end. Expect to arrive at a restaurant in three to four hours.

The March 21 rally is the first of five Saturday Series rallies this season. With a Series Pass, Cascade members can save money, register just once, and run the same car number for all five Saturday Series rallies. Just \$80.
