Subject: 2021 Geargrinders Budget Approval Request



Attached is the 2021 Geargrinders budget and the 2021 TSD Road Rally Schedule. This budget projects the season will finish with about \$500 profit. However, everything depends on attendance. More on that later.

Two big changes were made to the road rally program last season that enabled us to hold our events while most other activities were canceled due to the pandemic. We required online registration and virtual check-in, eliminating in-person on-site registration. And we implemented GPS timing and scoring, eliminating in-person checkpoints and scorecard interactions. End-of-event gatherings were replaced with emails announcing results and congratulating the winners.

Costs budgeted for those two changes were educated guesses in last year's budget. This year's budget reflects a much better understanding of those costs. The fee for online registration provided through MotorsportReg averages about \$2 per car for the Saturday rallies and \$5 per car for Mountains to the Sea. Of note, the Richta GPS Checkpoints app developer has generously offered to waive the \$3 per car fee for our Saturday rallies again this year. We will pay the app fee for Mountains to the Sea, as we did last year.

Event insurance has long been a major expense for the road rally program. Last year, insurance cost exceeded 40 percent of total expenses. We learned last season that the allocation of insurance cost is a lump sum, not determined by the number of events. However, the rally program tracks insurance cost by event. With nine events this season, the cost of insurance is \$187 per event. That cost averages about \$11 per car per event, equal to over half the \$20 entry fee for a club member.

Cascade's road rally program has benefited from the Board holding the allocation of insurance cost at \$1,680 for the last three years. The 2021 budget assumes that insurance cost remains steady.

Nine road rallies are planned for the 2021 season. The Rally School Rally starts the season in February. A virtual rally school will be offered prior to the rally. The Saturday Road Rally Series includes six events, one more than in the previous three seasons. Mountains to the Sea and Ghouls Gambol round out the schedule.


This budget assumes 15 cars enter the Rally School Rally and Ghouls Gambol, an average of 17 cars enter the nine Saturday Series rallies, and 25 cars enter Mountains to the Sea, for a season average of

17 cars per rally. We saw an average of 18 cars per rally in 2020, which was a dramatic increase over 2019's average of 14 cars per rally. Although our 2020 season attendance may have benefited from the cancelation of other events due to the pandemic, we are hopeful that the projection of an average of 17 cars per rally is achievable. As noted above, everything depends on attendance.

Essential to encouraging attendance is to ensure our events comply with all coronavirus safety restrictions. All events in 2021 will be TSsD (Time Speed social Distance) no-human-contact road rallies consistent with the Geargrinders Coronavirus Message. Online registration through MSR will remain mandatory. GPS apps will continue to provide event scoring. Participant and organizer safety is the top priority.

Keeping entry fees low also promotes attendance. Current pricing will be maintained for



Saturday three- to four-hour rallies at \$20 per car for members and \$30 per car for nonmembers, and \$55 per car for members and \$70 per car for non-members for the all-day Mountains to the Sea rally. Cascade's road rallies should be affordable.

Last season's road rally program attracted a new audience of road ralliers. The goal this year is to encourage those new participants to return again this year. Direct outreach to this new audience, in the form of sending personal invitations and incentives, will hopefully bring them back to participate again this year.

Retention is essential to achieving sustained attendance. Retention is improved when the events are well constructed and designed to improve the participant's experience. Participants who complete a rally with the least stress and most fun are likely to return and try it again. To accomplish this, we'll work with rallymasters to ensure each event is free from errors and ambiguities and that all the events are consistent in style.

Outreach is essential to attracting new and prior participants. Promotion of Cascade's road rally events through email, social media, Auspuff, and the Cascade Geargrinders website will continue. We'll work with CSCC Marketing to identify new opportunities to improve rally event promotion.

You can help by sharing road rally event announcements and promotions. Let us know if you identify new audience opportunities.

You can help even more by personally contributing to road rally attendance goals by participating. Find a partner you like to spend time with who would enjoy a drive in the country, decide who drives and who navigates, and start the season with the Rally School Rally on Feb. 20. Then make a date for one Saturday a month to play the game that takes you places.

Cascade board members, directors, conference reps, race officials, and committee chairs are offered half off the entry fee for the Rally School Rally.



The sustainability of the Cascade Geargrinders Road Rally Program depends on attendance. Over the last three years, attendance went from a season average of 11 cars per rally in 2018 to an average of over 18 cars per rally last year. We've previously noted that a season average of 20 cars per rally would provide a financially sustainable program. We are moving toward that goal.

Also essential to sustaining the program is consistent leadership and administration. We became Geargrinders Chair early in 2018, at a time when it seemed the program might vanish from lack of volunteers and participants. This coming season will be our fourth year as chair. It is time to start thinking about who will carry on after us.

One season of understudy would be advantageous for a new chair. If finding rallymasters to write road rallies is any indication (e.g., needle in a haystack), then finding an understudy for the Geargrinders Chair position may be a challenge. Recruitment for our replacement is underway.

We request the Board's approval of the 2021 Geargrinders Budget.
